

CITY OF ROSEVILLE

REFUSE / RECYCLING / COMPOST - INFORMATION / GUIDELINES

The City of Roseville has a contract with the private waste hauler – **Green For Life** - to remove our residential refuse. Green For Life collects refuse, recycling and compost. On your collection day your residence can be serviced by up to four (4) separate trucks:

1. General Refuse Truck
2. Recycling Truck
3. Compost Truck - for grass, leaves, brush and yard waste
4. Bulk Collection Truck – one bulk item may be placed curbside on your regular collection day (i.e. a couch, mattress & box spring, dinette set or appliance). Call Green For Life one day in advance for a very large/heavy item 866-772-8900.

* Note: Evictions, move outs, cleaning out a home are not standard residential refuse collection and property owners must take excessive refuse to a disposal facility, have a dumpster placed on the property or arrange for pick up with Green For Life or another waste hauler.

Any mattresses or furniture with bed bugs will NOT be collected unless **completely** sealed in heavy plastic and labeled "BED BUGS". Unwrapped items may be taken to Advance Disposal at 28315 Groesbeck, 888-443-1717 and dropped off for a nominal fee.

REGULAR WEEKLY COLLECTION

- All trash must be in the 96 gallon black refuse can provided to each residence.
- **SET OUT BY 7 am** on your collection day and **NO EARLIER than 6 pm** the evening before.
- Containers must be removed from collection area to the storage area by noon of the day following collection.

DISPOSAL OF SPECIAL ITEMS:

- Maximum weight limit of any ONE item is (sixty) 60 pounds.
- **CARPETING** – Securely bundled in rolls not to exceed 4' in length, no larger than 18" around and must weigh less than 60 lbs.
- **BUILDING MATERIALS** – one small item from a construction, remodeling or demolition household project - shall NOT exceed 60 lbs in weight or be longer than 4 ft in length. **Scrap wood / lumber** secured with heavy binding with nothing sharp protruding. Shingles and concrete are not accepted.
- **TIRE DISPOSAL** – take tires to a tire retailer and pay disposal fee or cut in quarters for trash pickup.
- **LATEX PAINT** - must be dried out completely, may add oil-dry or kitty litter - **leave lids off**. Place curbside next to black can with lids removed once solid and/or dried out completely.
- **WINDOW / PLATE GLASS / MIRRORS** - broken & placed in a sealed thick cardboard container clearly marked BROKEN GLASS.
- **NEEDLE / SHARPS** - Place in a heavy plastic container with the lid taped securely and drop off at the DPS, 29411 Calahan, Roseville, Monday through Friday, 7:30 AM to 3:45 PM.

COMPOST COLLECTION RULES (Grass Clippings, Leaves, Brush & Trimmings)

The State of Michigan has banned these materials from landfills and therefore all compost type material must be collected separately.

- Sod / Dirt / Stones are NOT accepted.
- Collected during compost season **ONLY** (first week of April to the beginning of December)
- 30 gallon brown kraft paper bags or 32 to 35 gallon maximum trash can clearly marked (compost stickers are free at City Offices). Must not weight over 60 lbs. **NO PLASTIC BAGS!**
- Securely bundled tree trimmings / branches (less than 2" in diameter) must be no longer than 4' in length, no more than 18" around and not heavier than 60 lbs. to be collected
- **NO LOGS, STUMPS, or ENTIRE SHRUBS**
- Compost placed out improperly or not during **compost season**, will NOT be picked up.

RECYCLING 18 gallon recycling bin or 64 gallon wheeled recycling cart (available from Rizzo 866-772-8900)

Acceptable items include:

- Plastics – containers with codes 1 through 7
- Grocery Bags
- Clear & Colored Glass
- Metal cans – flattened
- Paper, phone books, magazines, and brown paper bags
- Cardboard boxes (i.e. cereal, tissue, gift, shoe boxes) flattened
- Household batteries – place in small clear plastic bag on top of bin
- **NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING:** wax coated cardboard, window glass, mirrors, wood, aluminum food trays, styrofoam, ceramic, wicker, paper milk/juice cartons, medical waste, paint cans, propane tanks, chemicals, flammable liquids, household cleaners.

ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS

The Department of Public Services has a City-wide posting/warning "Notice of Ordinance Violation" program. Violations of City Ordinance, Residential Refuse Collection, Chapter 285, will be posted with a notice affixed to the front door of residences for the following reasons:

- a) Refuse out early (before 6 pm the day before the regular collection day)
- b) Refuse set out late (after 7 am on the regular collection day)
- c) Violation of **compost** collection rules
- d) Excess refuse placed out
- e) Uncollectible refuse or improper containers
- f) Containers not removed from collection area to storage area by noon of the day following collection
- g) Putting grass or leaves in the street – must place in containers or bags as compost
- h) Violation of **recycling** collection rules

Violators can be posted immediately and, if by the stated deadline the situation still exists, the Department of Public Services will clean it up with the property owner charged for all related costs.

DPS - CHIPPER SERVICE (For large amounts of brush or tree branches)

- Chipper service is available for \$70 per hour, with a ½ hour (\$35) minimum charge. A signed contract is required before this work can be scheduled (available at the Department of Public Services, 29411 Calahan and on the City of Roseville website). Chipper service is provided on Fridays. Call the DPS at 586-445-5470 for more information.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Items such as **pool chemicals, pesticides, fertilizers, solvents, turpentine, oil based paint, aerosol cans, non-narcotic medications, oven cleaners, fluorescent tubes/compact fluorescent lamps, motor oil, transmission fluid**, etc. are accepted at the Macomb County Health Department once per month. - ❖ **Great Lakes International Recycling** - 30615 Groesbeck Hwy, Roseville, 586-773-2930, between Common Road & 13 Mile Road. This is a metal scrap yard and accepts metal of many types.
- ❖ **Metropolitan Disposal** - 6451 E. McNichols, Detroit, 1-313-893-3388 (Located on Six Mile between Van Dyke and Mt Elliott). Items such as auto parts, construction debris, excessive amounts of household refuse, metal of many types are accepted.
- ❖ **Pinetree Acres** - 36600 29 Mile Rd, Richmond, 586-749-9698. Items such as auto parts, construction debris, excessive amounts of household refuse and large amounts of yard waste are accepted.
- ❖ **Clancy Concrete** - 29950 Little Mack, Roseville, 586-294-2900. Clean, broken concrete may be dropped off. No brick, patio stones, cinder blocks, etc.
- ❖ **Roseville Concrete** - 29765 Groesbeck Hwy, Roseville, 586-778-6860. Concrete ONLY.
- ❖ **Uni-Dig** - 21600 Quinn Rd, Clinton Twp., 586-791-4010. Items such as asphalt, concrete, brick & block, fill dirt, brush, leaves, grass, and tree stumps. Please call first.
- ❖ **Advance Disposal** - 28315 Groesbeck Hwy, Roseville, 888-443-1717. Items such as excessive household waste and oversized items are taken. Call first to verify times for drop off.
