Proposed Resolution
Redevelopment Ready Communities

WHEREAS, the Michigan Suburbs Alliance (MSA) originally launched Redevelopment Ready Communities (RRC) in southeast Michigan in 2003 to educate the communities involved and the public about the root causes of problems facing older established suburbs; now the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) is building upon the foundation MSA created and is expanding the program to be statewide; and,

WHEREAS, the mission of the MEDC is to market Michigan and provide the tools and environment to drive job creation and investment; and,

WHEREAS, the MEDC is committed to assisting communities in maintaining and attracting development and redevelopment, which will improve the economic vitality, eliminate blighting influences, and develop underutilized properties; and,

WHEREAS, the MEDC promotes community planning and public participation as one of the foundations of redevelopment; and,

WHEREAS, the RRC project was created to identify best practices for redevelopment and create a system for recognizing communities and adopt those practices; it is the first of its kind in the country; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Roseville has been selected to participate in the RRC program; and,

WHEREAS, communities must develop and meet various standards and requirements to become certified under this project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the City of Roseville has reviewed these standards and requirements and has elected to participate in the program that will improve the economic development process that will allow the steps for redevelopment to become more efficient, cost effective, decrease the building permit approval timeframe and decrease risk for all participating stakeholders and citizens; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City of Roseville commits to the participation in the program and the initial adoption and implementation of the standards; and,

BE IT FURHTER RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Roseville directs the Administration and the Planning Commission, Zoning Board of Appeals, and any other Boards involved in the redevelopment process to assist in the preparation and submission of this plan.
